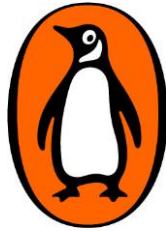

Handbook: *One Of Us Is Lying*

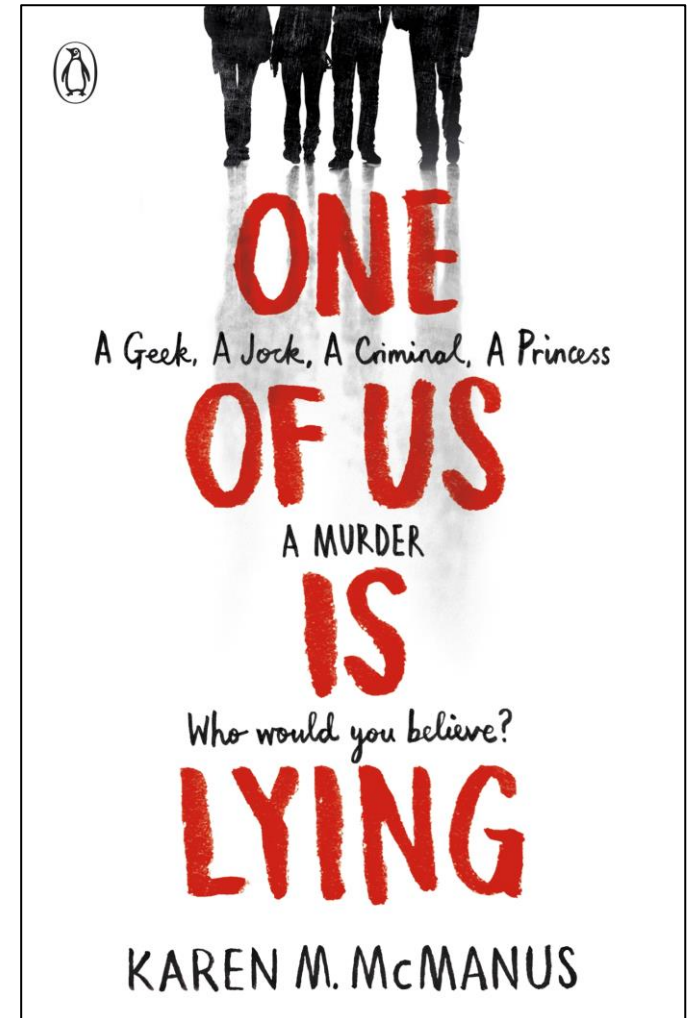
NTBC and our featured book

National Teen Book Club (NTBC) brings together 11 to 19 year olds from state schools and colleges across the UK in a shared, virtual book club.

We asked our Book Clubbers what theme they wanted for 2022/2023 and they chose Mental Health and Wellbeing. All of our books will present opportunities to consider and explore this theme, often from new angles.

Over four weeks, **9th November – 30th November 2022, Wednesdays at 3.30-4.30pm**, attendees will read international bestselling YA thriller – and now a major Netflix series – *One Of Us Is Lying* by Karen M. McManus.

Trigger warnings: drug use, abuse, cyber-bullying, sexual references, homophobia, murder, suicidal attempts/suicide, references to mass shootings, controlling behaviour, swearing.



Purchasing your book



As a member of National Teen Book Club, you can purchase discounted copies of our featured book. Schools and colleges can order **hard-copies** of *One Of Us Is Lying* for groups at 50% discount (£4.49 each). Young people can also buy eBooks for 99p and audiobooks for £1.99 with discount codes.

Reading schedule, speakers & surveys



As we discuss *One Of Us Is Lying* each week in breakout rooms, it's preferable that students keep on top of their reading.

- **For Week 1 – 9th November:** No reading necessary!
- **For Week 2 – 16th November:** Pages 3 – 129 (Chapters 1 – 11)
- **For Week 3 – 23rd November:** Pages 130 – 246 (Chapters 12 – 21)
- **For Week 4 – 30th November:** Pages 247 – 358 (Chapters 22 – Epilogue)

Do encourage students to take breaks or skip parts if needed – they can still join in the activities and discussion. **However**, there will be spoilers during sessions, especially in the live Q&A with *One Of Us Is Lying* author Karen M. McManus.

Attendees will also hear from speakers in the industry or with a passion for reading or links to the book – and they'll be answering your questions during our weekly events! Students should complete our [pre-programme survey](#), where they can also submit advance questions for our speakers. Live sessions & resources




Our weekly online sessions are delivered using **Microsoft Teams** and access links will be emailed out to you. We recommend downloading the Microsoft Teams application if you can.

Join us ready for a 3.30pm start on Wednesdays by clicking the link – you'll be held in the virtual lobby until then. We ask that you join on mute and stay on mute throughout the session (when in the main call).

If your camera is on during the main call, please ensure you and your students are not doing anything to distract other attendees or the speaker, otherwise we may have to remove you from the call.

Breakout rooms are an opportunity for your group to interact with others, so please try to turn on your microphone and camera at this point if you can – using video and audio will help everyone to get the most out of the experience and create that Club-feel! Educators will need to facilitate discussion within their setting and with other schools and colleges. Attendees will also be able to share thoughts via the chat and ask questions to our speakers using this function too.




Live sessions & resources



We record our sessions and upload them for participants onto Speakers for School pages online. This means that if any of your students are unable to attend, they'll be able to watch the recording back.

It is the responsibility of the school/college to manage permissions for engagement as per any social media/photography/audio recording/video recording Consent Forms they/their parents or guardians have signed with the school/college. Please review our Data Protection Policy and our Safeguarding Policy. We have a Consent Form available for you to pass onto parents if you wish. This is to gain permission from parents/guardians for their child's attendance and to direct them to our policies as well.

We know things may come up for you too: rest assured that any adult facilitator is able to cover a National Teen Book Club session. All they will need to do is ask students our Book Club questions. We also have a [Seenit Activity Pack](#) to explore on our website as an additional or alternative resource – you may wish to use this with your students if they are behind on their reading and want to avoid any spoilers that may be discussed in the breakout rooms.



Seenit



Seenit is a fantastic way to practise communication and presentation skills and to represent National Teen Book Club! Young people can complete offline activities via Seenit in between live sessions and have your group's work showcased during our weekly events.

Students can speak to camera or make a video of their written words if they would prefer not to be filmed, we don't mind either way! Type in the project ID to complete the relevant activity and record each line/clip according to the time limit. These can be re-recorded until you are happy with them.

Competitions

As participants in National Teen Book Club, students can explore their creative freedom, build storytelling and/or illustration skills and **WIN PRIZES** with our optional competitions:

Creative Writing ✍️

- **Brief:** In detention, Mr Avery asks the students to write about how technology is ruining American high-schools. Write a short 8-line poem about the power of technology (there are pros and cons!)
- **Prize:** The top four submissions will receive written feedback from an editor.

Illustration 🎨

- **Brief:** Draw a new book cover for *One Of Us Is Lying* (violent/disturbing images will not be accepted).
- **Prize:** The top four submission will receive a masterclass with a book cover designer.

TikTok 📺

- **Brief:** Create a TikTok book review for *One Of Us is Lying*. Reviews of the full book/book cover/blurb/specific chapters will all be accepted and students don't need to include their faces if they don't want to.
- **Prize:** The top TikToker will win a free YA fiction book.

Competitions

If students are entering our creative writing and illustration competitions, digital versions of written pieces and artworks will need to be emailed to ntbc@speakersforschools.org before the competition deadline of **Thursday 24th November, 9pm.**

Creative writing and illustration competitions winners aged 14-19 will also have their work published in our [National Digital Library and Exhibition](#). A consent form must be completed for this. Winners aged 11-13 will not be able to have their work published online, but will still receive our prizes!

Code of Conduct



We want National Teen Book Club to be a fun, positive and inclusive environment. Educators and students can help us achieve this by following our Code of Conduct:

- **Be on time** – Our live sessions start at 3.30pm. Click the link to access the live session just beforehand.
- **Be kind & respectful** – It's important to support one another and help each other with tasks during activities. This will help develop teamwork and listening skills.
- **Be considerate** – Stay on mute when others are talking. Don't use inappropriate language.
- **Be safe** – Do not share your personal details with anyone in the chat or in any other form. When in breakout rooms, groups can return to the main call or raise your hand if you need to speak to the host.
- **Be proactive** – Contribute to conversations with other attendees via the chat and Q&A functions as well as in breakout rooms using your camera and microphone, if you can. Submit questions for speakers during the Q&A, as well as for Speakers for Schools if you're unsure of anything; it's the best way for your group to learn and get the most out of the experience.

Code of Conduct: Misconduct



In the event an attendee's conduct, language or behaviour is inappropriate or disrespectful we will:

- Give a verbal warning to all & a written warning in the chat function in Microsoft Teams.
- They will be removed from the session if conduct does not improve.

There is a zero-tolerance approach to incidents of racism, homophobia, transphobia, violence, threatening behaviour and extremism. Anyone found to have instigated or participated in incidents of this nature will be immediately removed from the National Teen Book Club and potentially barred from future participation with Speakers for Schools opportunities.
